INTRODUCTION

The Alpha Kappa Alpha Educational Advancement Foundation Youth P.A.C. Program began as a vision in 1997 to involve young people in the philanthropic process. The Foundation's leadership knew that creating a program to channel youth philanthropic commitment to mankind would pay large dividends in the future, in the form of trained, capable leadership.

Currently, the program is structured for undergraduate Sorors led by a committee of undergraduates headed by the Foundation's 2nd Vice President (2nd Supreme Anti-Basileus).

MISSION

The mission of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Educational Advancement Foundation Youth P.A.C. Program is to promote healing, nurturing, learning and uplifting of youth by assisting in developing lifelong learning skills. This will be accomplished by providing awards and scholarships that support these issues.

OBJECTIVE

1. To develop leadership among undergraduates in the areas of criteria development, evaluation, and fund management.
2. To establish a specific relationship between undergraduates and the Educational Advancement Foundation (EAF).

ELIGIBILITY

Active Undergraduate Sorors, sophomores or above, holding a 3.0 GPA and demonstrating leadership, volunteer, and civic services.

***If applying for both Youth-P.A.C. and general scholarship, you will only be selected for one.**

Service Awards are one-time/one-year awards to Sorors and undergraduate chapters implementing platforms of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.:

- Emerging Young Leaders (EYL) Initiatives**
- Health Initiatives**
- Global Poverty**
- Economic Security Initiative**
- Social Justice and Human Rights Initiative**
- Internal Leadership Training for External Service Initiative**

This is an excellent opportunity for undergraduate chapters to experience grant writing and community service. Applications are available on-line.

SELECTION

Applicant selection is done by the Youth P.A.C. Committee. They meet to review and select finalists. Recommendations by the committee are then subject to final approval by the Alpha Kappa Alpha Educational Advancement Foundation Board of Directors.
